Blood Alcohol Concentration (BAC) refers to the weight of alcohol (expressed in milligrams) in a volume of blood (100 millilitres)?			
impaired driving, whether by alcohol or drugs, is the leading cause of death on Ontario roads.			
if you're caught driving with a blood alcohol concentration (BAC) from 0.05 to 0.08, police can suspend your licence up to 3 days for a first occurrence, 7 days for a second occurrence and 30 days for a third or subsequent occurrence.			
although alcohol-related crashes occur at all times of year, they increase during the summer months of June, July, August?			
a wide range of drugs have impairing effects on driving-related skills?			
you can be charged with impaired driving on your own property?			
you can be charged with impaired driving under the Criminal Code of Canada even if you have not been drinking at all, e.g., if the police officer determines that your ability to operate the vehicle is impaired by drugs.			
alcohol and boating do not mix - in Ontario you can be charged and have your licence suspended with a 0.05 Blood Alcohol Concentration (BAC).
